Privacy Notice

This privacy notice is issued by Luctonians Sports Club Ltd incorporating Luctonians Ltd and is compiled in accordance with the General Data Protection Regulations (GDPR).

Luctonians Sports Club Ltd and its incorporated subsidiary Luctonians Ltd (Hence referred as the Club) is set up in accordance with Rule 3 of The Rules of Luctonians Sports Club Ltd, which states:

Rule 3 Objectives

The objectives for which the Club is established are:

3.1 To promote community participation in healthy recreation by providing facilities for playing rugby union football and other sports (facilities mean land, buildings, equipment and organising sporting activities);

3.2 To provide and assist in providing facilities for sport, recreation or other leisure time occupation of such persons who have need for such facilities by reason of their youth, age, infirmity or disablement, poverty or social and economic circumstances or for the public at large in the interests of social welfare and with the object of improving their conditions of life; and

3.3 To advance the education of children and young people through such means as the Directors think fit in accordance with the law of charity.

The Club will use Legitimate Interests as its lawful authority to collect personal data and special category data so it can meet the objectives of the Club as stated.

In addition to the objectives above, the Club is required to collect Personal Data on behalf of Constituent Bodies and Sporting Authorities so that you are able to be registered and take part in your sport. In these cases, your chosen Sport will also have a Privacy Policy which will inform you as to why they want your data and what they will do with it. You should make yourself aware of these policies as well.

The aim of this notice is to inform Members, employees and any other person from whom the Club is likely to collect personal and or special category data.

For the purposes of GDPR, Personal Data and Special Category data is:

Personal data

Personal data or information can mean any information that is personal to you and from which someone could identify who you are or where you are. This is easily recognisable when you consider your name and address, but may be not so obvious when we talk about other things like photographs or videos that you might appear in while playing or enjoying the facilities at the Club, or locations data that might be linked with your use of our websites or social media.

Personal Data will also be information such as Club Membership Numbers that will be automatically produced by our systems to identify you, and 'cookies' that might be placed on your personal computer as a result of your use of our websites.

The GDPR apply to both automated personal data and to manual filing systems where personal data is accessible according to specific criteria. This could include chronologically ordered sets of manual records containing personal data, such as coaching records.

Sensitive personal data (Special Category Data)

The GDPR refer to sensitive personal data as 'special categories of personal data', in which the processing of personal data reveals racial or ethnic origin, political opinions, religious or philosophical beliefs, or trade union membership, and the processing of genetic data, biometric data for the purpose of uniquely identifying a natural person, data concerning health or data concerning a natural person's sex life or sexual orientation.

Personal data relating to criminal convictions and offences are not included, but similar extra safeguards apply to its processing detailed in Article 10 of GDPR. This data we are unlikely to know of unless as a result of a DBS check and is dealt with in our Policy on Data Baring Service Checks.

Processing Data

To achieve the objectives of the Club and expectations of the Membership, the Club will need to collect personal data so we can identify who our members are, enable the Club to communicate with them across various mediums and meet the expectations of the membership as a whole or parts thereof. In some cases, we will need to collect special category data, such as medical information, in order that members can participate in chosen sports and activities at the club safely, and so the Club or its representatives can respond accordingly in cases of injury or emergency. Next of kin and their contact details will similarly be collected for the same reason. This information is only collected as next of kin reference is subject to the same level of rights and protection as any other personal data collected

At all times the Club recognises the need to keep personal data and special category data secure and strictly private. We will not share any personal data or special category data with a third party unless there is expressed consent by the data subject or a data subject's legal guardian in respect of a young person under the age of 16 years. Any Personal or Special Category Data that is lawfully required to be shared will be, sharing the minimal amount of data necessary to achieve the requisite requirement.

For example, all playing members will agree that where personal data is required by their chosen sport's Constituent Body or Sporting Authority to register them as a participant in their chosen sport, this information will be shared.

Likewise, special category personal data (Medical Information) that is held by the Club in relation to a member who is actively participating in their chosen sport and as result of which an injury occurs, relevant medical information will be shared with third party medical professionals who are attending to the injury or illness, if it is relevant.

We will also share personal information when we are required to do so by the legitimate request, in writing, from recognised organisations such as the Police or Government Authorities.

The Club recognises that Photography and Videography are forms of personal data. The Club reserves the right to collect this data and use it in circumstances to help the membership benefit from analysis of this data or to celebrate the ethos and spirit of sport for which the Club exists. The Club also recognises the individual member's right to state how such data is processed and used as described below.

- The Right to be informed – We will tell you what we are doing with your information.
- The Right of Access – You have a right to know what we do hold about you and to see it.
- The Right of Rectification – This means that you have the right to ask the Club to amend any data held that is not correct.
- The Right of Erasure – This means that any information we hold, you can request be deleted.
- The Right to Restrict Processing – This means you can request that we do not use your information in certain ways or for certain purposes for example displaying photographs of you on the website.
- The Right to Data Portability – This means if you request a copy of the personal data that the Club holds on you it must be supplied in a format that you can access and read.
- The Right to Object – This means the Club must stop doing things with your personal information if you request it.

The further rights to automated decision making, including profiling is not relevant as the Club does not conduct automated decision making or profiling.

You also have the right of appeal and complaint to the Information Commissioner's Office if you believe we are not working correctly within the GDPR.

Retention of Personal and Special Category Data

The Club will retain any Personal or Special Category Data for only as long as necessary and once the data is no longer required it will be securely destroyed or permanently and securely deleted from all of the Club's systems and files.

Personal Data that identifies current members and related membership data will be kept up-dated as necessary for the period that the member continues active membership of the Club. When a member's membership is allowed to lapse, then personal data will be kept about that membership for 3 years before it is subject to deletion.

In the case of Special Category Data, this data will be immediately deleted from the Club's systems and files when it becomes no longer relevant.

In respect of permission granted for the specific use of personal data, this will be kept for as long as the use of that data is on-going. For example, if you agree to take part in a promotional video for the Club and sign a consent notice we will keep that consent for as long as necessary.

Security of Personal and Special Category Data

The Club takes very seriously the expectation of members that their personal data and special category data is kept private and secure.

In order to meet these expectations, the Club has produced a Data Security Policy and undertakes to make sure that all persons employed by the Club or by virtue of their volunteer role in the Club receive training in the subject of Data Security and the requirements of the Club's Data Security Policy.

Marketing data

Under no circumstances will the Club share your personal data with a third-party marketing organisation. Occasionally we might want to pass on to you information that has been supplied to us by sponsors or associates of the Club that we feel you as an individual might have an interest in. When signing up to membership this particular question will be asked of you and you will have to specifically select that option to benefit from such information. Likewise, the Club will promote events that it is hosting and again at the time of signing up to membership you will have to opt in to receive such information.

Website, other third-party applications and Cookies

The Club acknowledges that to supply its services to its members it has to employ the use of third party digital media such as website hosting and maintenance, digital membership application and recording and social media platforms. Where such applications are supplied and maintained by third parties, the third parties will display their own privacy notice and explanation of how they handle such data on the Club's behalf. They will also be responsible for explaining their cookie policy and how they use cookies. The Club acknowledges that they are still the data controllers of the information collected by third parties on the Club's behalf.

The Club will also make sure that all third parties used to provide website, social media facilities, or other relevant electronic data for the Club will do so in conjunction with the Club's Policy on Photography, Videography and Electronic Communications.
