



Code of Conduct

Sundogs Festival is a Sports, Music and Beer festival. It is a community festival which invites sports teams, the local community, and the wider community to come to together for a weekend of enjoyment. Every staff member, volunteer, external supplier, and attendee is expected to follow and conform to our code of conduct. Organisers of the event will enforce this code of conduct.

Our Festival Standards

Sundogs Festival is dedicated to providing a safe and enjoyable experience for everyone, regardless of age, gender identity, sexual orientation, disability, physical appearance, body size, ethnicity, race or religion.

Examples of unacceptable behaviour by participants include:

- Harassment in any form.
- Deliberate intimidation, stalking, or threats.
- Violent threats or language directed against another person.
- Sexist, racist, homophobic, transphobic, ableist, or exclusionary jokes.
- Unwelcome sexual attention or advances.
- Unwelcome physical contact.
- Threatening or physical actions towards any member of staff, security, or attendee.
- Advocating for, or encouraging, any of the above behaviour.

Unacceptable behaviour from anyone working or attending the festival, will not be tolerated. Anyone asked to stop unacceptable behaviour is expected to comply immediately.

If anyone engages in unacceptable behaviour, the festival organisers may take action they deem appropriate, up to and including a temporary ban or permanent expulsion from the festival without warning and with no refund.

Procedure for Handling Incidents

Participants asked to stop any harassing behaviour are expected to comply immediately. If a participant engages in harassing behaviour, event organisers retain the right to take any actions to keep the event a welcoming environment for all participants. This includes warning the offender or expulsion from the festival with no refund. Event organisers may take action to address anything designed to, or with the clear impact of, disrupting the event or making the environment hostile for any participants.
